On behalf of the over 250,000 students and families our organizations serve across greater Los Angeles, we are writing to express our concern about the state of labor negotiations with SEIU Local 99 and their demand for equitable wage increases, more full-time work, respectful treatment, and increased staffing levels. We want to encourage an equitable resolution and believe in the Superintendent's leadership to make this happen.

SEIU 99 represents thousands of essential district employees including food service workers, custodians, bus drivers, special education assistants, and teacher assistants. While we have all experienced the impacts of a life-changing pandemic, we cannot forget how SEIU 99 members showed up for our district.
